Singer and guitarist Martin Hutchinson from Holland played Irish Folk, ballads and blues in Körle.

Martin Hutchinson from Ireland is a humble, quite singer, storyteller and guitarist and that's exactly how he captures the public's attention. His genre is Irish folk, ballads and the blues which he mixes with his own style. He catches moments, pictures and views with his songs, setting them in the past, present and future.

With his warm voice and professional guitar chords he captures melancholic dreamers, travellers, experiences or encounters in bars. He is playing with words in a funny way, for example, when he sings about the potatoes, the national dish of Ireland. He also creates a completely different color of tone when he is using his round chrome tubes for his bluesy music.

With his stories between the songs he explain the lyrics of the songs. Hutchinson grew up in a musical talented family in Ireland. He now lives in Holland, but he often travels back home to Ireland to find new inspirations for his music.

His song "Maggie" is a song about his grandmother. She gave birth to 16 children, eight of them died. This pain had a major influence on her life and when she had her glass of whisky she started singing the old Irish songs.

The public in the Green Harp validated the musician and he played two encores for them.
